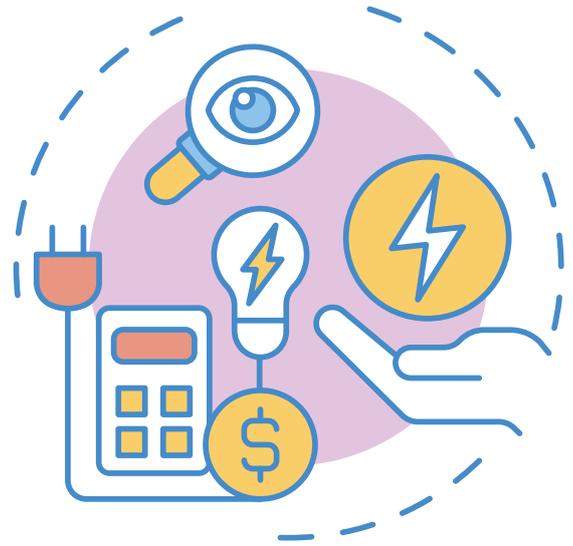


Saving Victorians millions on their power bills

Delivering the \$250 Power Saving Bonus



The Victorian Government \$250 Power Saving Bonus program aimed to help Victorians pay their energy bills and encouraged them to compare energy offers to save money.

The Power Saving Bonus Outreach Program ran in three 'phases' – January 2021 to January 2022, July 2022 to March 2023, and March 2023 to August 2023 and Victorians could receive one bonus in each phase. The program ended in August 2023.

Good Shepherd and Neighbourhood Houses Victoria (NHVic) collaborated to support people who may not have heard about the program, didn't have good access to a computer or the internet, or needed extra help to apply for the bonus.

Good Shepherd provided telephone support, and in-person assistance was available at over 200 participating Neighbourhood Houses across Victoria, with 57,352 applications approved and \$14,338,000 of direct financial support provided.

Working together to improve energy affordability

The program eased financial stress for Victorians

With the increases to gas and electricity prices, and recent rises in the cost of living in Australia, participants reported that they were increasingly unable to pay for their energy, rent and grocery bills. Many program participants were concerned over increases in their gas and electricity bills.

Good Shepherd and Neighbourhood Houses were able to support clients who needed additional help applying to access the \$250 bonus to help them cope with these rising costs. A survey of Outreach Program clients found that:

80%

said they were experiencing financial stress (N=60)

94%

of clients who reported financial stress believed the \$250 bonus would lower their stress (N=48)

The Program offered more than just the \$250

Community Outreach workers at Good Shepherd and Neighbourhood Houses worked with people to make sure they were getting the best offer on their energy bills.

Outreach workers also helped people find other ways to save money on their power bills, made sure they were getting all the concessions they were eligible for, and if needed, helped them switch providers.

Victorians learned other ways to reduce energy costs and save on energy bills

Good Shepherd and Neighbourhood Houses outreach workers also provided energy affordability support.

Staff reported that the Outreach Program provided an important opportunity to sit down with people and discuss what their needs may be, help them to understand what offers may be available to them, and explain how they can go about accessing these offers.

Additional cost-cutting measures included:

- ensuring concession entitlements were applied for future and past bills
- helping participants access the Victorian Default Offer and the Utility Relief Grant Scheme,
- providing at-home energy cost saving information.

Surveys showed that program participants said that the Outreach Program increased their awareness of energy affordability supports and other ways to reduce their energy costs.

The face to face and phone service meant more people could benefit from the program and \$250 rebate.

of clients said the support increased their awareness of other energy saving programs and offers (N=60)

89%

of clients said the support gave them ideas on how to reduce their energy costs (N=60)

Saving Julie more than \$250

Julie*, a woman aged over 70 who is living alone, attended Seville Community House to submit her PSB application. Seville Community House staff reviewed how much Julie was paying on her electricity bill and tried to compare her plan on Victorian Energy Compare. However, when this was attempted, the portal did not accept Julie’s rates as they were so high. Julie was on high percentage pay on time discount and did not realise her rates were so high until she failed to pay on time, which cost her an extra \$300. Staff phoned Julie’s provider on her behalf and spent over an hour discussing this with them. Julie just wanted to leave her plan as it was. Knowing that this would only benefit her provider, staff persisted and managed to successfully move Julie to a better plan. Julie decided to return to Seville Community House when she receives her next bill, so staff can support her to do a thorough comparison and determine if there is a better offer with an alternative provider for her.
